Intranasal Strangles	Yearly vaccine when appropriate for the mare. No difference due to pregnancy.												
<b>DEWORMING</b>	Deworm every 3-4 months with Ivermectin or Quest (series). Do not rotate products. The mare should be dewormed again at the time of foaling. In fall give Ivermectin with Praziquantal or Quest plus Praziquantal.												

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
